Moving towards a circular economy and a resource efficient society will be the future for Europe, but this means that additional legislative initiatives are necessary. There is a need for a more comprehensive resource-efficient, waste and product policy. With the publication of the European Commission's roadmap 'Circular Economy Strategy' the Commission has announced to come up with a 'new and more ambitious proposal' on the waste review.

Biowaste plays a key role in sustainable waste management. Biowaste accounts for the largest fraction (40%) in municipal solid waste. Only 30% of biowaste across Europe is collected separately and recycled in a sustainable way by composting and anaerobic digestion.

With new waste legislation more than 50 million tonnes of biowaste could be recycled, which will result in the creation of 100,000 new jobs.

Against this background, this event will offer the opportunity for key decision-makers and stakeholders to discuss the importance of separate collection and recycling targets for biowaste as well as setting end-of-waste criteria for compost and digestate to place these recycled materials as products on the European market.
