# A *serious* problem

#### *Impacts*

- Ghost fishing: Wasted fish and impacts on marine life: 100 % of turtles, 66 % of mammals and 50 % of seabirds affected
- Microplastics & POPs: Potential health impacts
- Economic cost (degradation of marine and coastal ecosystem services, beaches clean-up, damaged fishing gear)





#### **Marine Strategy Framework Directive**

- "Good Environmental Status" by 2020
- 11 "descriptors"
- Descriptor 10: "Properties and quantities of marine litter do not cause harm to the coastal and marine environment."

#### • Indicators:

Trends in amount/composition/spatial distribution and, if possible, source of litter on beaches/water column/seafloor

Trends in amount/distribution and, where possible, composition of microparticles, in particular microplastics

Trends in amount and composition of litter ingested by marine animals



#### **Marine Strategy Framework Directive**



- COM report: <u>Assessment</u> of first round of implementation
- Charts the way for programmes of monitoring (2014) and measures (2015)
- JRC: <u>Guidance on</u>
   <u>Monitoring of Marine Litter</u>
   in European Seas



#### **Plastic bags Directive**

- c.100bn single-use plastic bags p.a. (c.200 per person)
- 8 billion bags as litter
- Reductions of up to 80% possible
- EU implements measures to reduce their use





## **7**<sup>th</sup> Environment Action Programme

- EU quantitative reduction target for marine litter
- Limiting landfilling to residual waste
- Limiting energy recovery to non-recyclable waste





# **Planned next steps**

- Establishment of a baseline for marine litter quantities in the EU marine regions to monitor progress towards reduction target
- Consideration of marine litter and microplastics in the forthcoming Circular Economy Package
- Filling knowledge gaps with a view to tackling sources or forms of marine litter of concern, such as microplastics in products
- Implementing regional plans against marine litter



# A **shared** problem, a **joint** response

### Regional cooperation

- Barcelona Convention (Mediterranean): First RSC to adopt an action plan on marine litter
- OSPAR (North East Atlantic): Action Plan adopted in June 2014
- HELCOM (Baltic): Action plan adopted in June 2015
- Bucharest Convention (Black Sea): marine litter as part of overarching strategic action plan



# A *shared* problem, a *joint* response

- Rio+20: Collectively commit to take
   action; achieve significant reductions
   by 2025; prevent harm to the coastal
   and marine environment; recognises
   plastic problem
- Study focused on plastic litter to be presented to UN Environment Assembly in 2016
- G7 adopts in June 2015 an Action Plan for marine litter
- Post-2015 agenda: Towards an SDG for oceans?





Marine litter stands for wasted material, threat to biodiversity and to human health: its organic link with the resource efficiency agenda needs to be better understood and communicated
