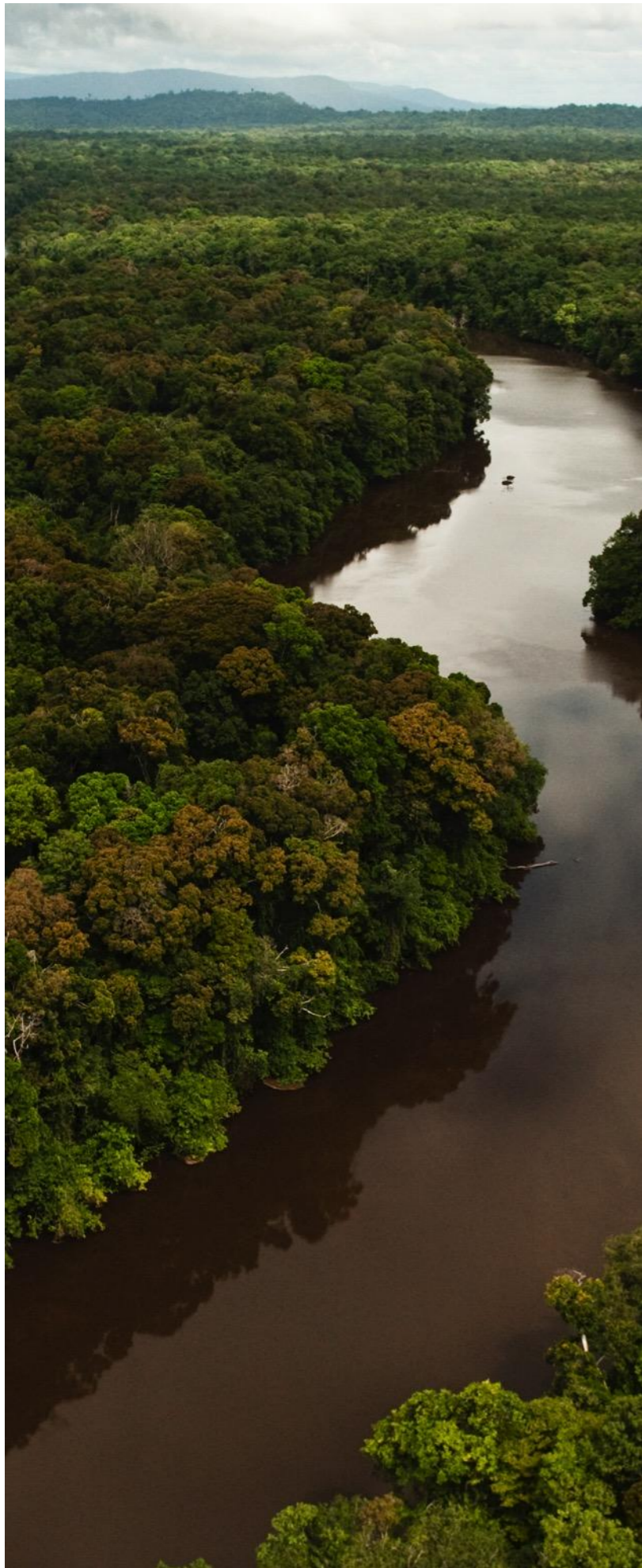

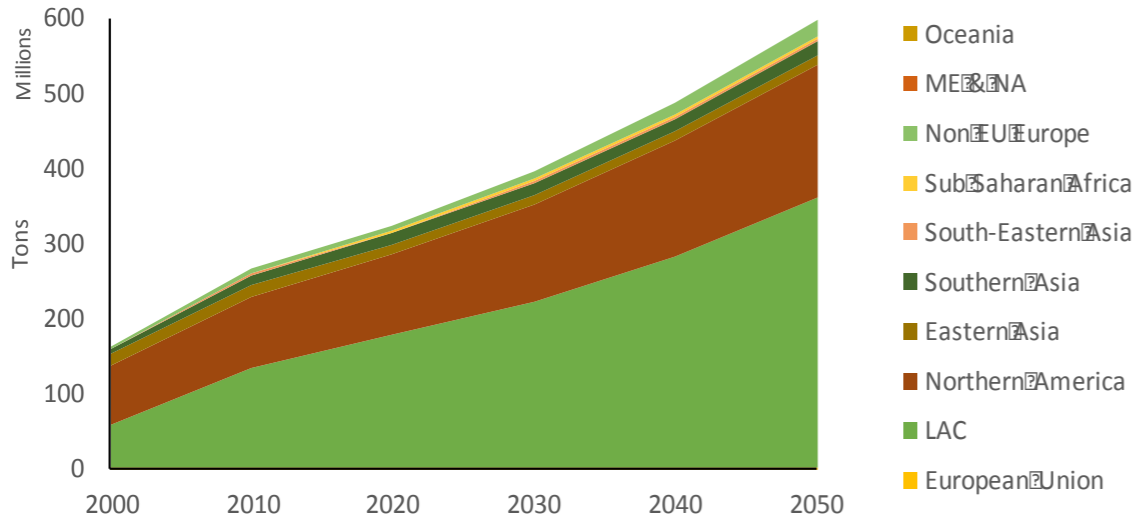

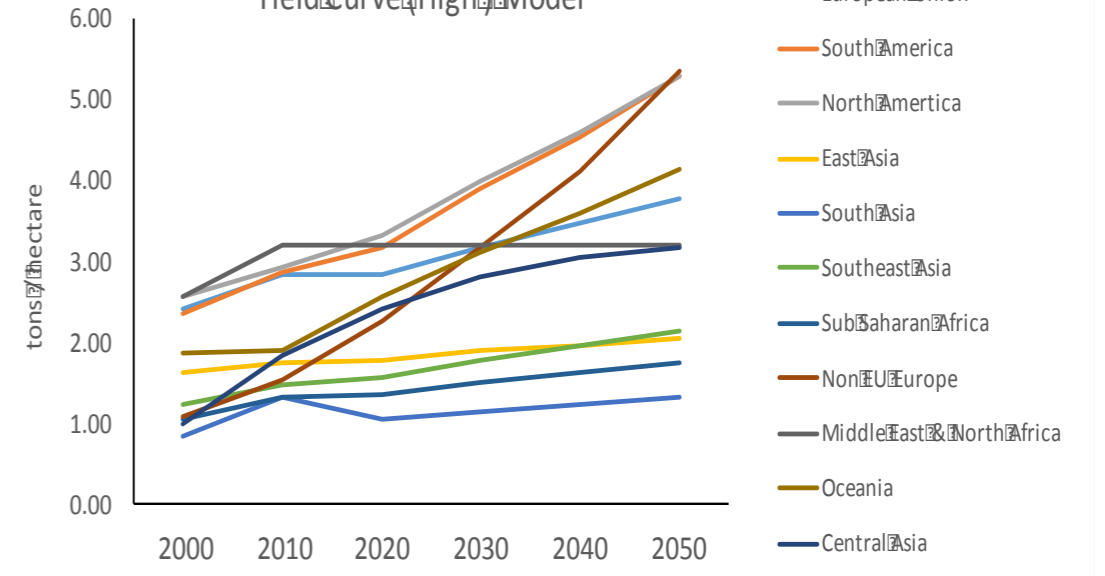
Soy

Total Soy Production (HC) BAU Model

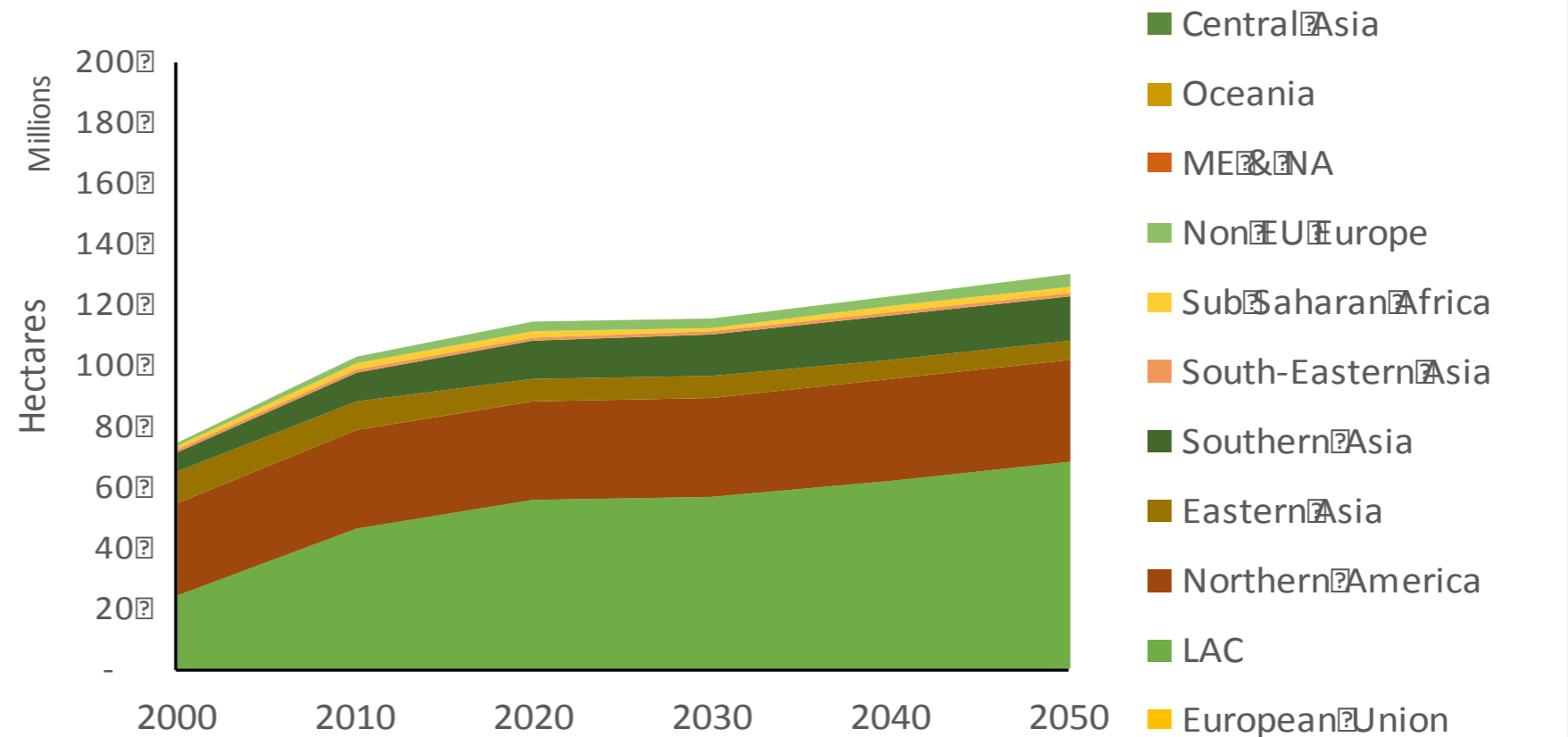


X

Invest in sustainable intensification

- Overconsumption and food waste need to be addressed
- Continuous increase in yields:
 - is required
 - must be done sustainably
 - must be achieved in a time of climate change
 - requires assistance to smallholders

- *Launch research calls to identify adequate technologies*

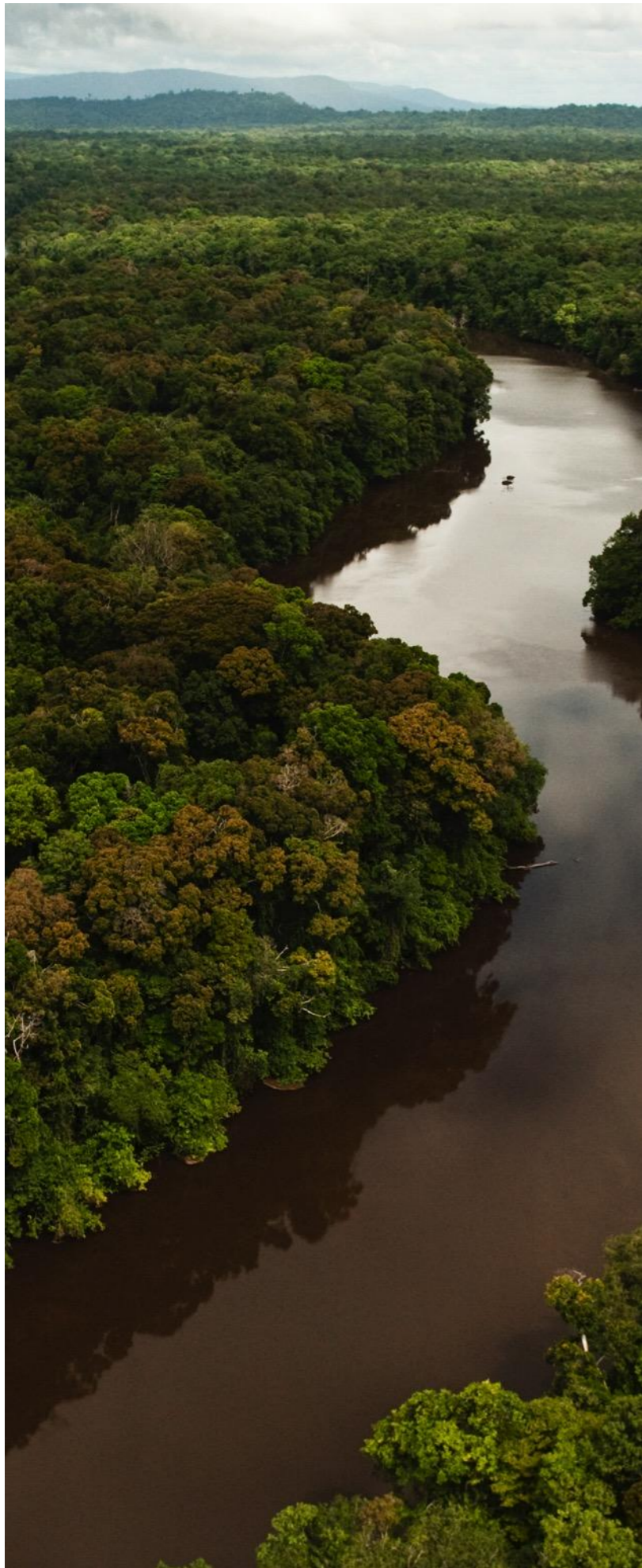

 - REDD+

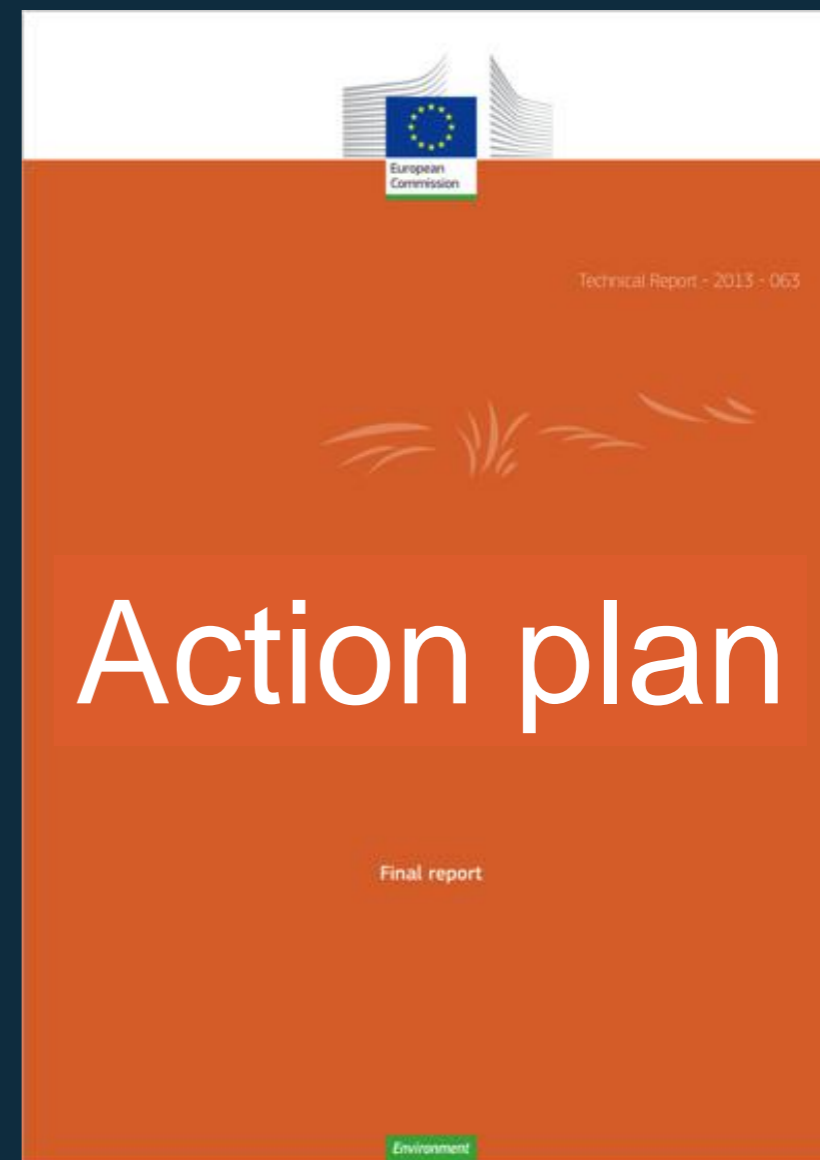

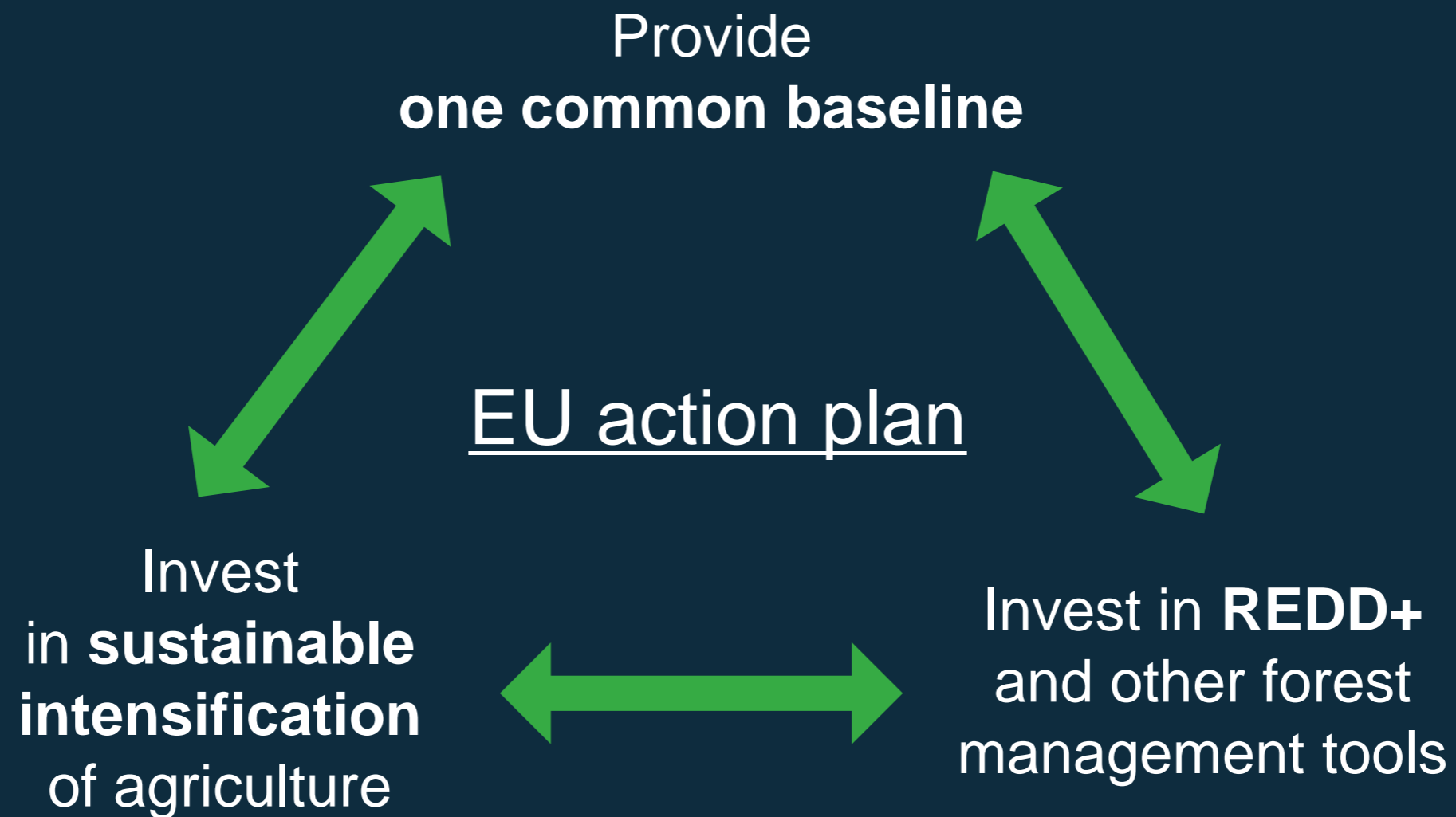
