


Types of situations:

- Strong or weak governance
- National or international
- Level of political clout of the fisheries sector
- Strong or weak institutions of stakeholders
- Massive fisheries or a few players
- Export or domestic or subsistence fisheries
- Knowledge base adequate or not
- Level of sophistication of the fishing sector
- etc., etc.

CAPTURE (in the gear)



CAPTURE = CATCH + BYCATCH + RELEASE

Bycatch

Why it happens?

- Bad luck (wrong place, wrong time)
 - Wrong species is captured by chance or swims into gear
- Wrong size of right species
- Wrong species is associated with right species
 - Multispecies Schools
 - Predators
 - Prey
- Wrong species tries to take bait (seabirds, sea turtles)
- Wrong species tries to take the catch from net or hook
