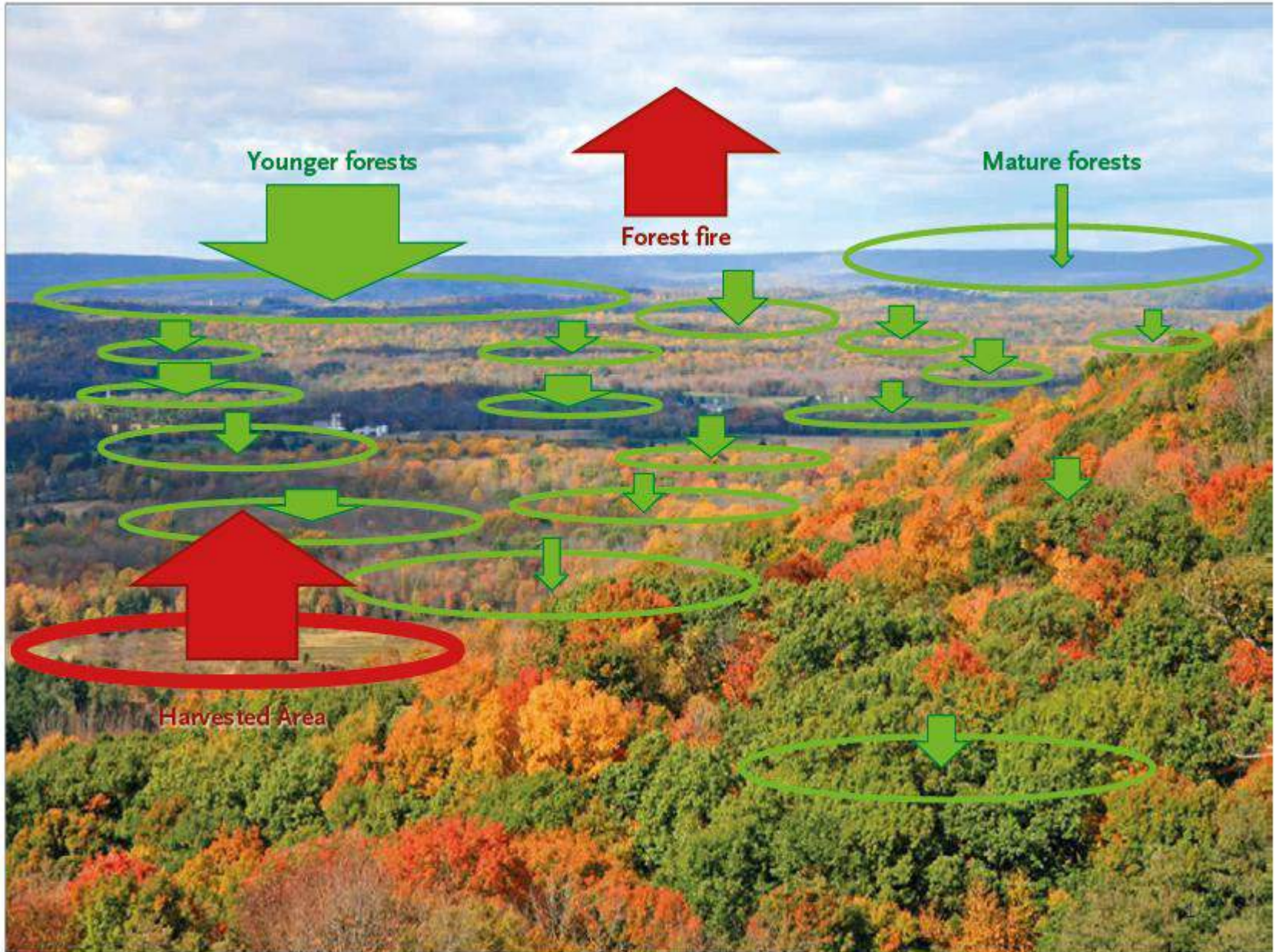
Standing volume of the Swedish forest



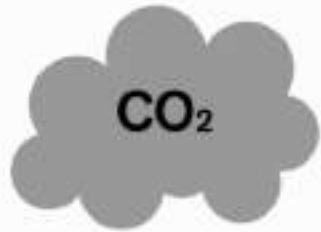

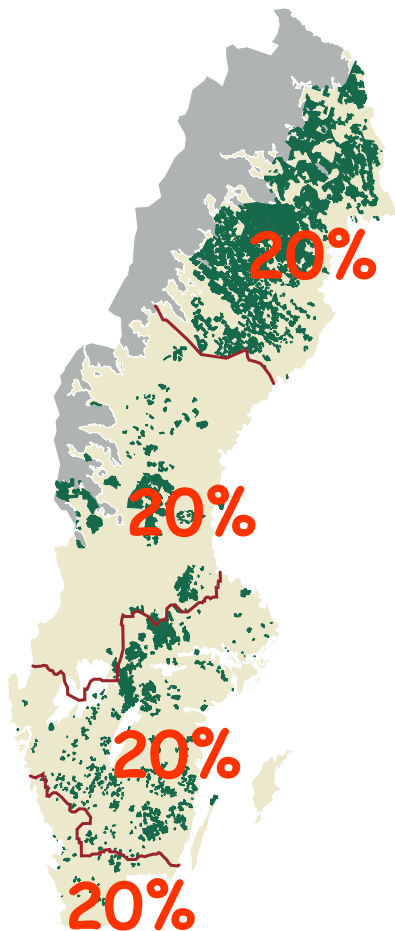

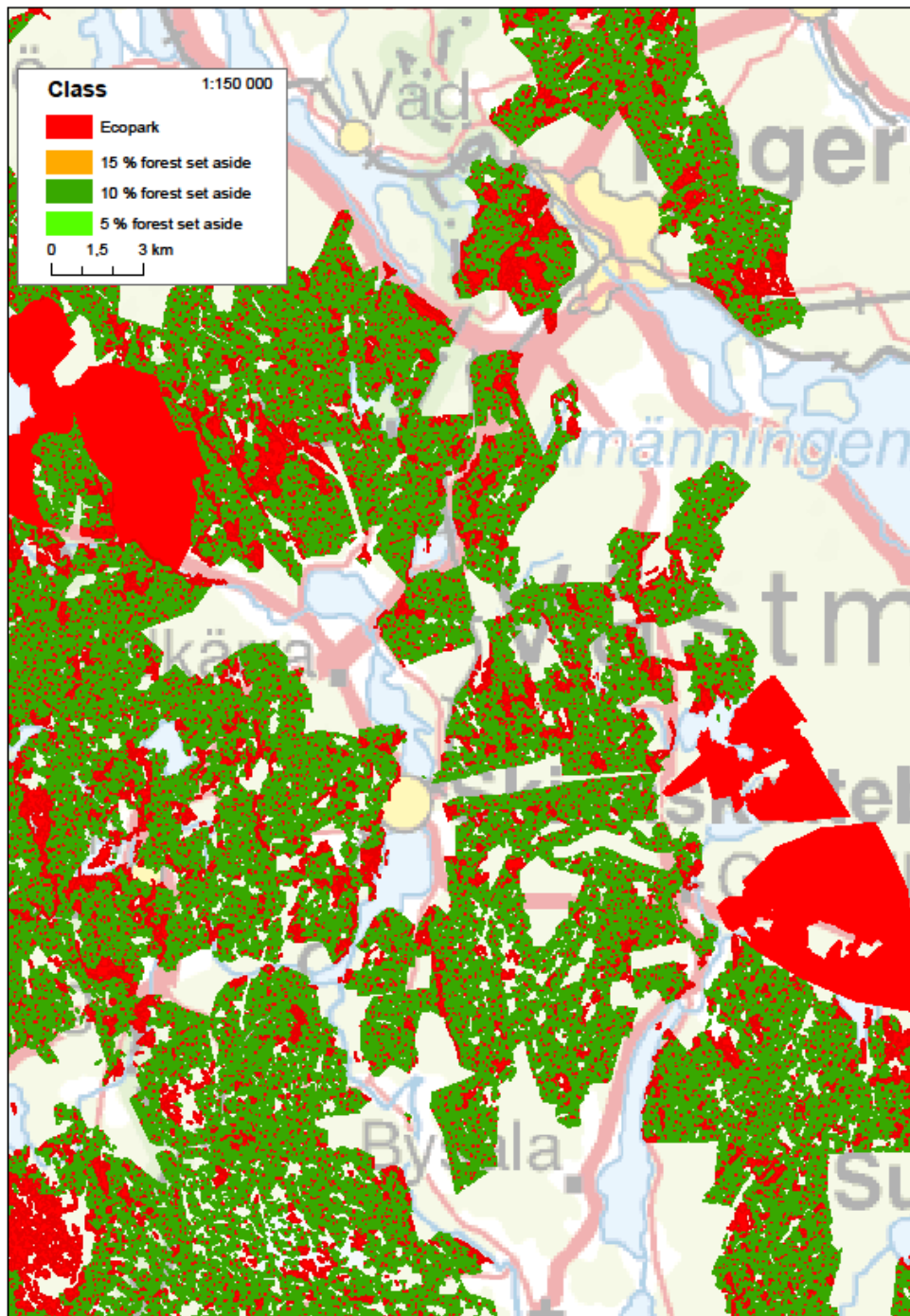
