► EU pursued ambitious agenda for the Northwest Atlantic Fisheries Organisation

The European Union participated in the meeting of the Northwest Atlantic Fisheries Organisation, which took place in Montreal from 18 to 22 September 2017. Representatives of 12 Contracting Parties deliberated on conservation and enforcement measures for this regional fisheries management organisation (RFMO). The meeting took place for the first time under a revised NAFO Convention. The focus of the meeting was to set the total allowable catch (TAC) for fish stocks under this organisation to ensure their sustainable management. The EU seeked solutions based on the best available scientific advice, aiming to ensure sustainability for the stocks and predictability for the industry's future.

► <u>Commission proposed Baltic Sea fishing opportunities for 2018 with increased quotas for herring and salmon</u>

In particular, the Commission <u>proposed</u> to increase catches for Central Herring, Sprat and the Main Basin Salmon stocks, and to maintain the number of catches for the important stock of Western Baltic Cod. For the remaining stocks the Commission proposed reducing catches. This year's proposal also includes a ban on Baltic Eel fisheries, not traditionally a part of the annual allowable catch proposals but a necessary step due to alarming scientific evidence and historically low levels.

▶ New scientific report shows positive economic trends for EU fishing fleet

According to the latest Annual Economic Report, the overall economic performance of the EU fishing fleet improved again in 2015.

While marginally profitable in 2009, the EU fleet registered record-high net profits of EUR 798 million in 2015 and estimates for 2016 and 2017 point towards further increases in profitability. The report also demonstrates that economic performance stagnates where fleets depend on stocks which are still overfished or overexploited. More and more fleets that exploit stocks sustainably see clear improvements in their profitability and salaries.

Karmenu Vella, Commissioner for environment, maritime affairs and fisheries, said: "It is encouraging to see that the positive trend of the last years has resulted in higher salaries for fishermen, bigger profits for the fishing sector and more value added for the EU's fishing and coastal communities. This clearly shows that our joint commitment towards more sustainable fishing pays off. But more efforts are needed to allow also small scale coastal fleets, in particular in the Mediterranean and Black Sea, to fully benefit from this positive trend. Continued progress towards Maximum Sustainable Yield (MSY) in all sea basins will therefore be a precondition for achieving economic viability."

European Parliament

European Parliament's Plenary session

► Whale hunting in Norway

An <u>oral question</u> on whale hunting in Norway was submitted to the EC on the 22nd June 2017 by MEPs Sirpa Pietikäinen, Renata Briano, Mark Demesmaeker, Catherine Bearder, Anja Hazekamp, Keith Taylor, Eleonora Evi, on behalf of the ENVI Committee.

A <u>motion for a Resolution</u> was released by the European Parliament ENVI Committee in September 2017 to the Plenary for adoption and several amendments were tabled (amendments <u>1-4</u> and <u>5-10</u>).

During the EP Plenary session, MEPs voted on the amendments and on the motion for a Resolution as a whole which was **adopted**.

► <u>Multi-annual plan for demersal stocks in the North Sea and the fisheries</u> exploiting those stocks

Following the legislative <u>proposal</u> by the EC for a Regulation on establishing a multi-annual plan for demersal stocks in the North Sea and the fisheries exploiting those stocks, the PECH Committee released a <u>draft report</u> together with <u>amendments 33-314</u> and <u>315-321</u> to this proposal.

In June 2017, the PECH Committee voted on the draft report and its proposed amendments, and the report was **adopted**. The committee also voted on the mandate to enter into negotiations, but this was **rejected**.

In July 2017, a <u>draft report</u> together with <u>amendments 001-078</u>, <u>079-079</u>, <u>080-085</u>, <u>086-091</u>, <u>092-096</u>, <u>095-095r1</u>, <u>097-097</u>, <u>098-099</u>, <u>100-100</u>, and <u>101-101</u> to this proposal were published.

During the EP Plenary session, MEPs voted on the amendments on the EC proposal as a whole, which was <u>adopted</u>. MEP Ulrike Rodust asked for this report to be referred back to the PECH Committee to start the inter-institutional negotiations, and this was **adopted**.

European Parliament's Committees

Committee on Fisheries

The PECH Committee, at its meeting of the 25th September, discussed the following issues:

► Exchanges of views

 Management, conservation and control measures applicable in the Convention Area of the South Pacific Regional Fisheries Management Organisation (SPRFMO)

Following the EC legislative <u>proposal</u> in March for a Regulation laying down Management, conservation and control measures applicable in the Convention Area of the South Pacific Regional Fisheries Management Organisation (SPRFMO), MEPs and the EC discussed the <u>amendments</u> proposed by the PECH Committee. The deadline for amendments is the **03/10**.

• Optimisation of the value chain in the EU fishing sector

This own-initiated report was attributed to the S&D group on 21st of June and MEP Aguilera was appointed rapporteur. This report aims at supporting the efforts made to improve employment in the fisheries sector and economic conditions of fishermen. MEPs had a first exchange of views on what should be included in this report.

► Exchanges of views with the Commission

Proposed eel quotas in the Baltic Sea for 2018

Following the release in August 2017 of a EC legislative proposal for a <u>Council Regulation</u> fixing for 2018 the fishing opportunities for certain fish stocks and groups of fish stocks applicable in the Baltic Sea (+ <u>Annex</u>), the PECH Committee had an exchange of views with the Commission regarding the proposal: "It shall be <u>prohibited</u> for Union fishing vessels to fish for, to retain on board, to tranship or to land European eel (*Anguilla anguilla*).

• Delegated acts and implementing acts

Currently, the PECH Committee is examining 1 delegated act: <u>Commission Delegated Regulation</u> amending Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2016/2374 establishing a discard plan for certain demersal fisheries in South-Western waters: deadline for what on the **05/11**.

European Parliament Think Tank¹

Here are the latest fisheries-related briefings, studies and fact sheets published this month:

► Research for PECH Committee - Marine recreational and semi-subsistence fishing - its value and its impact on fish stocks

This study assesses the value and impact on fish stocks of marine recreational and semi-subsistence fisheries in Europe. Total economic impact of marine recreational fishing amounts to 10.5 billion euro, supporting almost 100,000 jobs. The impact varies between fish stocks, representing 2-72% of total catch. The marine recreational fisheries are biologically and economically important, so should be included in stock assessment to ensure sustainability, and considered a sector for development alongside commercial fisheries and aquaculture under the Common Fisheries Policy.

▶ In-Depth Analysis: Aquaculture: An overview for the European Union

This document aims to provide the reader with an overview of the state of aquaculture in the European Union, its diversity and challenges. It addresses the policy at European level to give impetus to this sector of activity in the Member States as well as prospects for development in the coming years (although it is not possible at this stage to take account of the changes that will result from the future exit of the United Kingdom of the Union).

► <u>Study: Regional ocean governance in Europe: the role of fisheries</u>

This study requested by the European Parliament (PECH Committee) examines regional ocean governance in the European regional seas in the context of fisheries. It assesses key regional organisations (the Regional Fisheries Management Organisations (RFMOs) and Regional Seas Conventions (RSCs)) examining the mechanisms by which they cooperate and coordinate as well as their outcomes, within the context of EU policy.

The note provides a review of the main characteristics and specificities of Japan fisheries sector and related activities. As a reminder, the European Parliament is due to decide a position in plenary in advance of interinstitutional negotiations on a legislative proposal for a multiannual plan to manage some fisheries in the North Sea. For its part, the Council adopted its general approach in April 2017.

► EU fact sheet: Pacific

The EU is the Pacific region's fourth trading partner, although the volume of trade is small in both absolute and relative terms. The EU is currently preparing to negotiate free trade agreements with Australia and New Zealand, which are important trading partners. The EU has partnerships in the

region with the 15 Pacific Independent Island Countries (PICTs), focused on development, fisheries and climate change, four Overseas Countries and Territories (OCTs), and the Pacific Islands Forum (PIF).

▶ Transposing international measures for Atlantic tuna fisheries into EU law

Following the approval, in June 2017, of the outcome of interinstitutional negotiations by the Committee on fisheries, the EP is due to vote on a proposal for a regulation concerning the conservation of tuna and tuna-like species, and the management of fisheries targeting these stocks in the Atlantic Ocean, with a view to reaching a first-reading agreement. This legislative proposal aims to transpose into EU law a number of binding recommendations adopted by the International Commission for the Conservation of Atlantic Tunas (ICCAT). To become applicable, notably to operators such as the masters of fishing vessels, these measures must be enacted in EU law. The EC is also proposing that future ICCAT recommendations for some fisheries management measures should become part of EU law through delegated acts. Owing to its purpose (transposition of internationally agreed measures), this legislative proposal is not accompanied by an impact assessment and was not the subject of a public consultation.

A dedicated morning session on Copernicus Marine Service was organised by EBCD as Secretariat to the European Parliament Intergroup on Climate Change Biodiversity and Sustainable Development, chosen for its emblematic role: an open forum for discussion, that gave all stakeholders the chance to convey their messages right in the heart of the European Union. The event was chaired by MEP Ricardo Serrão Santos chair of the Intergroup "Biodiversity & Ecosystem Services" working group. This conference was the occasion to highlight the many ways the Copernicus Marine Environment Monitoring Service supports Public Authorities in the implementation of the EU directive (e.g. MSFD), contributes to blue growth development, supports the private sector in their respective markets and is engaged in ocean literacy. Stakeholders from the public sector, private sector and civil society highlighted today's achievements, answered questions, as well as discussed the challenges of tomorrow.

This session was part of the Copernicus Marine week (25th to 29th September): a week-long dedicated <u>event</u>, each day covering different themes, from science to operations, and from R&D to production.

► The fourth International Marine Protected Areas Congress (IMPAC4)

The fourth International Marine Protected Areas Congress (IMPAC4) met in Chile, from 5-8 September 2017. Organized by the Government of Chile, IUCN and with the World Commission on Protected Areas (WCPA), over 1000 representatives from governments, international and non-governmental organizations, and local communities, as well as members of civil society and others met to discuss issues around the theme 'Marine Protected Areas (MPAs): Bringing the people and ocean together' underscoring the intricate nature of the ocean-human relationship and the benefits of MPAs and the ocean, for the many dependent on their ecosystem services.

It brought together, among others, managers and practitioners of marine conservation to share knowledge, experiences and best practices on issues such as: MPAs and global change, including climate change and ocean acidification; MPAs and coastal communities, including empowerment of women, and development and economic growth; effective, successful management of MPAs, including sustainable development initiatives and finance for MPAs; and, MPAs and shared future visions, including marine spatial planning and youth-led collaborative action.

IMPAC4 concluded with a **high-level meeting**, where participants reflected on the outcomes of the Congress, and looked towards what action needs to be taken to continue conserving the ocean. A **Call to Action** was approved, which called on those present to: ensure appropriate financial mechanisms for MPAs; integrate climate change considerations into MPAs; and, engage with women, youth and local communities to enhance MPA creation and management.

▶ 39th Annual Meeting of the Northwest Atlantic Fisheries Organisation

The 39th Annual Meeting of the Northwest Atlantic Fisheries Organization (NAFO) took place from 18 to 22 September in Montréal, Canada. Over 180 delegates from 11 NAFO Contracting Parties were welcomed by NAFO President, Stéphane Artano, and the Honourable Dominic LeBlanc, Minister of Fisheries, Oceans and the Canadian Coast Guard. The meeting marked a NAFO milestone, being the first Annual Meeting held under the amended NAFO Convention, which came into force 18 May 2017. These amendments to the Convention modernise NAFO, particularly by incorporating an **ecosystem approach to fisheries management**. This approach includes safeguarding the marine environment, conserving marine biodiversity and minimizing the risk of long term adverse effects of fishing activities on the marine ecosystem. The amendments also streamline NAFO's decision-making process, strengthen the obligations of Contracting Parties, Flag States and Port States, and institute a formal dispute settlement mechanism.

► FARNET Guide #13: Social inclusion for vibrant fishing communities

This **FARNET** guide published in September 2017 aims to help Fisheries Local Action Group (FLAGs) identify and effectively address social exclusion in fisheries areas. It is intended primarily for FLAG managers and board members as well as local actors involved in social activities. It could also be of help to managing authorities and national networks that are supporting FLAGs in dealing with social inclusion issues.

The factsheets in Part A cover four types of issues typically found in FLAG areas: finding alternative/complementary livelihoods in fisheries communities, generational renewal in the fisheries sector, inclusion of vulnerable groups in fisheries communities, and integrating migrants and refugees.

In Part B, the factsheets focus on solutions addressing issues in FLAG areas, in particular: linking social inclusion to enterprise, building strategic partnerships with other actors, and integrating social inclusion in animation and operating procedures of the FLAG.
