




Then they are ragged jackets for about 1-2 weeks.





Harp seals become mature around 5 years of age







The harp seal catch numbers in the west Atlantic







Pup production have fluctuated between 800.000 and 1.6 million



The fraction of the adult females that give birth has fluctuated between 20% and 86%











Ringed seal estimates

Most ringed seal surveys estimate the number of seals that haul-out on the ice during the moulting season (in May-June)

Estimates based on polar bear numbers Polar bear : Ringed seals 1 : 200 25.000 : 5 million







Why do we think that the ringed seal hunt is sustainable?

Ringed seals are distributed over vast areas and only hunted in a tinny fraction of their habitat.

The Greenland hunt is mainly on young seals – the adult breeding population will in most areas be undisturbed.

The present catch level in Northwest Greenland has been maintained for almost a century.
