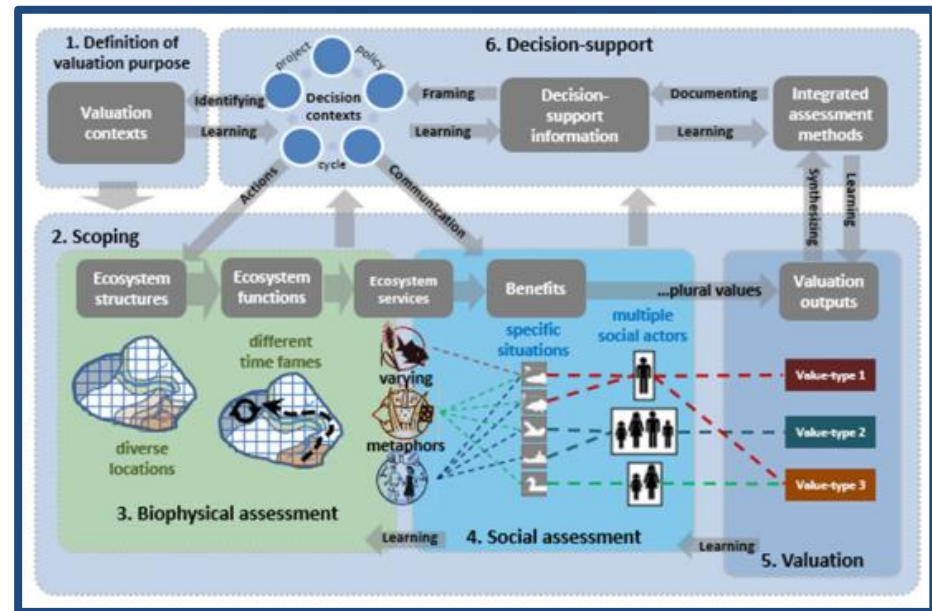
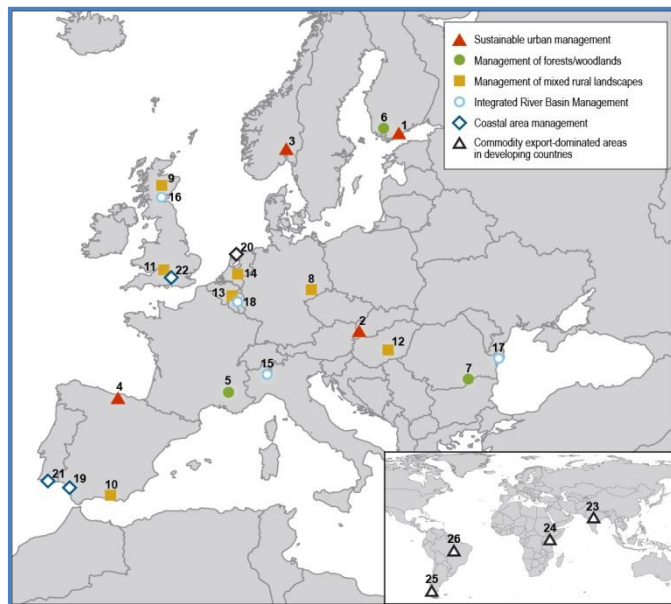

- **Ensuring**
 - wellbeing of biodiversity in Europe, globally
 - provisioning ecosystem services in Europe, for Europe and for other parts of the world
 - ecosystem services as a key player when building pathways for sustainable development locally, nationally, in Europe and globally
- **Research needs for resilience and transformation**
 - means to deal with difficult trade-offs
 - nature-based solutions in handling climate change, urbanisation, land use, human migration, production of goods
 - integrated policy, practices and behavioural change for transformation
 - justice and other ethical issues
 - how flows of goods, people and finances within Europe and between continents affect global ecosystem services and human migration patterns
 - women and children as players of the future of ecosystem services
