UN Environment Regional Seas Programme

- Established in 1974 as a UN Environment's flagship programme
- Provide a framework to protect the marine environment through the cooperation of neighboring countries at the regional sea level
- Contributes to the implementation of UN Convention on Law of the Sea
- "States shall cooperate, as appropriate on a regional basis, directly or through competent international organisations [...]" (UNCLOS (Article 197))



18 Regional Seas With 7 administered by UN Environment



UN Environment Regional Seas Programme

- Governed by the participating countries through Conference of Parties or linter-governmental meetings
- Function through their Action Plans
 - Action Plans are often underpinned by Conventions
 - Protocols developed under Convention
- Action-oriented programme
 - Implementation on the ground to address marine environmental degradation
- Funds come from the participating countries (Trust Fund) plus donor funding for specific action-oriented projects

UN Environment Regional Seas Programme


Mandates generally cover:

- Monitoring and assessment of coastal and marine environment and ecosystems;
- Land-based sources of pollution;
- Ship-based emergency pollution;
- Marine and coastal biodiversity and marine protected areas;
- Environment Impact Assessment and Strategic Environment Assessment
- Integrated coastal zone management; and
- National and regional marine environmental legislations.


Regional Seas and Sustainable Development Goals
