OTHER EFFECTIVE AREA-BASED CONSERVATION MEASURES (OECMS) IN THE BLUE

What are OECMs and How will they improve delivery of biodiversity conservation?

BACKGROUND

As implied by their name, the Other Effective Area-based Conservation Measures (OECMs) are area-based measures (ABMs), other than designated protected areas (PAs), that are used to manage various economic activities, and that make an effective contribution to broader in-situ conservation of biodiversity (composition, structure and function). In fisheries, ABMs play an important role in the sustainability of target resources. The potential for many of them to be considered as (or upgraded to) fishery-OECMs is receiving increasing international attention because of their potential to: (i) improve the sector's contribution to Aichi Target 11, providing biodiversity conservation outcomes that complement those of PAs; (ii) increase the visibility and effectiveness of such contribution; and (iii) strengthen the ecosystem approach to fisheries tool-box (EAF). The definition and guidance produced at the CBD Expert Meeting on OECMs (Montreal; February 2018) were accepted after minor modifications as CBD.SBSTTA/22/L.2 recommendation and have been forwarded for further consideration and adoption at the CBD COP 14. This side event reviews the implications of OECMs definition, principles and criteria for fisheries.
