What do we want and need from EU Forests?

A simple question, but a complex answer:

- Different interests and objectives of forest owners
- Different societal interests, different in rural/urban areas
- 4.5 mio. jobs along the forest value chain
- Forests ecosystems are so diverse from Sicily to Northern Finland and from Ireland to Turkey



Policy framework is needed ...

- At Global level 2030 Agenda for Sust. Develop. with 17 SDGs
 - (e.g. WWF report 2021: Europe is responsible for 16% of loss of tropical forests)
- Framework needs to be inclusive and address trade-offs
 - E.g., set aside of large forest areas in Europe might lead to leakage effect (M.
 Dieter et al, 11/20:30% strict protection 42% lower roundwood production in EU)
- Sustainable forest management which includes strict protection of biological hotspots but also sustainable use
- Stakeholder involvement is key particularly for public forests


- to promote sustainable forest management

Vision 2030 – Bratislava Declaration

- European forests are sustainably managed to be resilient, healthy, productive, and multifunctional, and contribute to sustainable development
- recognise the key role of public and private forest owners and managers
- acknowledge the importance of stakeholder involvement
- support forest research and to communicate evidencebased knowledge on forests and sustainable forest management
